**LITURGICAL NOTE:** Today is the last official day of the choir season, next week begins the Summer Choir. You will notice that the choir plays a large role in today's liturgy — from leading the Te Deum, which replaces the Gloria on Trinity Sunday, to chanting the psalm to Anglican Chant, and singing an anthem. Please join us in thanking the Parish Choir for their ministry after the service. Additionally, we start our worship with a *Solemn Procession*, beginning at the front of the church and processing in a figure eight. This gives today an extra solemnity and joy, appropriate for all special Feast Days, and reminds us also of the play of the Trinity, the interweaving of lives and loves in Father and Son and Holy Spirit — like the bands of a Celtic knot. - R.F.
