

FeST NEWS! Mark your calendars for **December 3rd, 10:00 am- 2:00 pm** for FeST, our annual Christmas bazaar to raise funds for local organizations serving our community. Planning is underway for it to be in person, with craft "surprise" boxes full of home-made goodies, baked goods, and our traditional wreaths and roping for sale. We hope to find some way to make pre-orders online but are still working on that. We also will have a beautifully refurbished dollhouse in a "silent auction" sale.
